# ★ 2024 Statistics ★

**813** unduplicated young people engaged with at least one Life House program

## **661 youth accessed critical necessities**

The Drop-in Youth Center is the only drop-in center for youth ages 14 to 24 in the region and connects young people to our services and community partners. Visitors have immediate access to basic needs including meals, hygiene supplies, showers, laundry, and trustworthy adults.

## **Connected 329 youth to housing resources**

The Community Housing Program serves as the primary youth access point to connect with St. Louis County's Coordinated Entry System. In 2024, Life House served 329 youth in the Community Housing Program, which opens doors to permanent supportive housing opportunities.

## **Provided specialized housing for 6 teens**

Sol House offers a safe and confidential residence for teens, ages 15-20, who have experienced human trafficking and/or commercial sexual exploitation. Youth at Sol House have immediate access to all Life House services, in addition to 24/7 supportive case management.

## **Facilitated wellness activities with 271 youth**

The Wellness team is comprised of five interdisciplinary professionals. In 2024, staff provided mental health counseling to 165 youth, 85 youth received substance use counseling, 61 youth received parenting and family support, and 271 received wellness case management services.

## **Empowered 67 youth to achieve employment goals**

To work toward financial stability, 67 youth received employment support and assistance with job placement, and 7 youth participated within our paid career readiness program (the Legitimate Hustle Program). LHP offers comprehensive case management and job training.

## **Supported 64 youth with their education goals**

Education credentials open new doors for youth and 64 youth received education support, and 11 youth earned their GED. Life House provides flexible and supportive options for youth pursuing their high school diploma, and assistance applying to post-secondary opportunities.
